The optimum consistency and whole oat flakes ensure easy eating. A feast especially for tits, finches, sparrows, woodpeckers, yellowhammers and blackbirds. ## Fodringsanbefaling:

Our volaris grainballs are suitable for feeding all year round! As these are always freshly produced natural products, the outside temperature also has an influence on the appearance.

It is possible that some dumplings may no longer have an "optimal" shape or may even be broken when you receive them. We would like to explain how this can happen.

Our grain balls are free from additives and only have a "natural" binding through the fat. Unfortunately, natural fat becomes softer at temperatures above  $10^{\circ}\text{C}$  and therefore the binding can weaken. Especially in summer at high temperatures, even in the delivery vehicle, it can happen in extreme cases that even all dumplings arrive damaged or broken!

In turn, cold temperatures in winter can cause the balls to harden and become firmer. As a result, they can no longer crumble or break so easily. It can happen that the birds don't like pecking at the dumplings for the first few days.

It helps if you press the dumplings down a little before laying them out so that they become slightly more oval. This gives the birds a better "attack surface" for their beaks. Alternatively, crumble the dumplings and place the crumbs on the ground in a shallow dish in the garden or mix them with the scattered food. Of course, the birds also like to eat the broken tit dumplings just as much as the whole ones

**Our tips for the warm season:** o Store the fatballs in a cool and dry place, e.g. in a cool cellar.







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**Our tips for the cold season:** o Store the fatballs in a dry place at approx. 15 degrees, press the fatballs lightly before hanging them up o Protect the dumplings from moisture, e.g. by using covered feeders, to avoid icing up
